Schedule A

Availability:

Available in all territory served by the Cooperative, subject to the Terms and Conditions of the Cooperative on file with the Virginia State Corporation Commission.

Applicability:

Applicable to Members of the Cooperative for single-phase farm and home and single- or three-phase churches. Farm and home service under this schedule is limited to single-family occupancy.

Character of Service:

Single-phase, 60 cycles, at a secondary nominal voltage of 120/240 volts. Where applicable, three-phase, 60 cycles, at standard nominal secondary voltages of 120/240Δ, 120/208Y or 277/480Y.

Monthly Rate:

I. Distribution Delivery Service Charges:

Consumer Delivery Charge:

Single-Phase	\$18.00 per month
Three-Phase	\$30.00 per month

Energy Delivery Charges:

First 100 kWh delivered	@ \$0.04510 per kWh
Over 100 kWh delivered	@ \$0.03940 per kWh

II. Generation and Transmission Charges:

Energy Charges:

All kWh sold	@ \$0.07902 per kWh
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Each kWh sold is also subject to a charge or credit under provisions of the Cooperative's Power Cost Adjustment clause, Schedule PCA-1.

Note: The above Delivery Service and Generation & Transmission charges apply to those Members who have the Cooperative as their energy service provider. Only the Distribution Delivery Service charges apply to those Members who have an Electricity Supplier other than the Cooperative as their energy provider.

Minimum Monthly Distribution Delivery Charge:

The minimum monthly charge for distribution delivery service under this schedule shall be the Consumer Delivery Charge where 15 kVA or less of transformer capacity is required. For Members requiring in excess of 15 kVA of transformer capacity, the minimum monthly charge shall be increased by \$1.00 per each kVA in excess of 15 kVA.

Special Terms & Conditions:

- a) Motors having a rated capacity in excess of 10 horsepower will only be permitted on single-phase service upon approval of the Cooperative. The Cooperative reserves the right to reject the use of motors exceeding 10 horsepower upon finding such installations would interfere with the quality of service rendered to other Members of the Cooperative.
- b) The Cooperative reserves the right to refuse service where the capacity of the Member's load justifies three-phase service on an economic basis.

Churches will be served under this rate schedule in accordance with state statutes.
